Omeo

Over the weekend, Janet and I caught up on a recent episode of **Back Roads, in which** Heather Ewart relayed the untold stories of the men and women of Omeo and surrounds.

Victoria's High Country has long been famous for its cattlemen and horsemen, but this episode of Back Roads tracks down the area's extraordinary women, described as the backbone of the region.

The episode focusses on the untold stories of the men and women of Omeo and surrounds, whose grit and determination have seen them survive droughts and bushfires.

A lot of these mountain people have spent their whole lives around Omeo. It's in their blood. Those that have ventured away, like physiotherapist Jill Hill, have returned, finding the pull of their home too strong. Heather explores the story of Jill and her mother who have teamed up to successfully run the family farm.

Heather also meets Jim 'Hardhead' Flannagan. He was the 'pick-up' man at the Omeo rodeo for 55 years, a volunteer job he only gave away when he turned 77.

Sisters Tahnee Orchard and Aleshia Sievers are true horse women of the High Country. They grew up chasing brumbies and cracking stockwhips. They were so good with a whip, they were asked to crack them in the opening ceremony of the 2000 Sydney Olympics! Years later Tahnee was dealt a huge blow with ill health. Heather learns how the women in Tahnee's home town of Benambra, just outside Omeo, stepped up to help.



We found this particular episode inspiring as it is filled with stories of humble characters who brim with a sense of optimism, wisdom and care for one another.

2020 OHR Family Reflections

Monday's Virtual Assembly contained an interview that I conducted with our two school captains in Bridget N and Meg M. During the interview both girls teased out an idea that Bridget had suggested some weeks ago. Bridget had originally proposed that, as a school community, we have an opportunity of sharing our stories and leaving a memory about the current times we find ourselves in.

Our captains have proposed that each family prepare a page that will go towards a book. The page will need to be **A3** in size and **landscape** orientation. The page should include the **family surname** and be a reflection of these times including: what it was like, how they coped, and how they felt. This may comprise a combination of any of the following:

- Stories
- Drawings
- Artwork
- Photos of the family engaging in activities together
- Poems

- Words
- Recipes
- Song lyrics
- Celebrations shared during COVID-19 time.

When completed, each family will be required to make a PDF copy of their page. The family pages will be called for in approximately four week's time. The school captains will provide details of where to email the family page.

The books will be professionally produced. Two copies will be made for the school and families will be able to explore one of the proofs. At that time we will provide the necessary details, should families choose to purchase a copy.

New Classroom Furniture

With heartfelt thanks to the OHR PFA, the school is now able to proceed in finalising an order for new contemporary and flexible classroom furniture for classes in Prep, Years 1/2 and Years 3/4. The student furniture is bright, colourful and lightweight, allowing for a range of configurations that will support collaborative student learning. The new furniture will be functional for both students and classroom teachers, and will serve to enhance the appearance of our learning environments and subsequently the school. Bright and contemporary furniture not only supports the posture of the students, but can serve to boost their wellbeing while presenting the school in a modern light to any visitors.



The order for the furniture will be placed this week, allowing

approximately eight weeks until final delivery and assembly. With a bit of luck the furniture will be ready for Term Four.

The PFA generously donated approximately 67% towards the final cost of the furniture with the school contributing the remaining 33%.

The school could not have embarked on this purchase without the generous support of the PFA which, in turn, has been supported by countless fundraisers orchestrated by our OHR parents over recent years.

St Benedict's School closure

With enrolments declining over recent years, St Benedict's School, Burwood, will regrettably close at the end of this year. The decision was an extremely difficult but necessary one. With a number of other Catholic schools nearby, unfortunately, St Benedict's was no longer viable to operate. Parish Priest Rev Daniel Serratore and Catholic Education Melbourne have worked closely with the school leadership team throughout the decision-making process and will continue to support students, staff and families to continue their journey with Catholic education.

Operation: Community Connect – Camberwell Police

From July 1 2020, the *CommConnect* initiative commenced across the Eastern Region of Victoria Police. *CommConnect* is a different approach to Policing. Officers (usually at Sergeant level) have been assigned to engage with key stakeholders in specific sectors matching the Boroondara Council wards to the Boroondara Police Service Areas, more directly focusing resources to build stronger and more collaborative relationships.






