Introduction

Purpose

Our teachers have made a commitment to keep all children safe. This means that the students at our school feel safe and not worried or scared that something bad will happen to them. The teachers and staff in our school know what to do if a student says they feel unsafe. Our students are taught skills to use when faced in an unsafe situation.



Commitment to Child Safety

All students attending OHR have the right to feel safe. The school tolerates no bullying or any kind of unsafe behaviour.



Risk Management

At OHR we make sure our school is safe at all times. Teachers and staff keep our school environment safe by fixing any harmful situations right away. Students should always tell an adult if they see an unsafe situation.



Code of Conduct

OHR makes sure there is a Code of Conduct for all teachers, Learning Support Officers, receptionists, parish priest and staff, emergency teachers, parent helpers and other visitors that clearly explains the behaviour that they need to show.

Hiring Staff and Staff Training

Before employing staff and helpers, OHR checks the background to see if the person is suitable to work with children.

Once they have settled into OHR they get more information and training about child safety.
