Dear Parents and Parishioners,



Science in Prep

The Preps explored the engineering process and the strength of various 3D shapes during remote learning when they had to build a stand to support a tin of food. This week they used that knowledge to construct the tallest tower using limited toothpicks and plasticine balls. According to Mrs Axon, there was lots of testing and improving before we had success!





With Thanks to our PFA

Back in July, the PFA invited the school community to submit proposals for the allocation of PFA funds to support and enhance the education and welfare of the children at OHR. This opportunity is available once every calendar year in accordance with the rules of the PFA.

The PFA received submissions from Mrs Stephanie Axon (Science teacher) and Mrs Josephine Harrison (Digital Technologies Manager). Submissions had to be received by the closing date of 4 September.

A PFA Fundraising Expenditure Subcommittee was established to determine that the proposals met the criteria established by the PFA.

The proposals were subsequently presented to, and voted on, by members of the PFA during last week's meeting.

Of the \$13,200 of available funds for proposals, approximately \$1,200 was granted for the purchase of five dual power stereo microscopes for the Science room, with the remaining funds enabling the purchase of further Chromebooks, iPads and relevant licences.

On behalf of the school staff, I would like to thank the PFA – and all parents, for that matter – for the generous allocation of funds. The children will be the true beneficiaries of these purchases.





Emergency Management Training

Next week all the staff will participate in Emergency Management training with Emma Gladman from Dynamiq. Dynamiq specialises in emergency management and emergency response planning.



To ensure compliance with AS3745-2010, there is a requirement for Warden Training to be completed at least once every 12 months.

The training session will cover the structure, roles and responsibilities of the Emergency Control Organisation (ECO), the basic principles of building safety systems and how to implement the appropriate procedures for various emergencies. It also covers effective communication and describes human behaviour in emergency situations and the role of the emergency services.

Emergency management maps and plans are clearly displayed throughout all our classrooms and public spaces, such as the church and the hall.

If, as a parent, you are ever on-site during an emergency management procedure, we ask that you listen carefully to the instructions delivered over the PA system and follow them accordingly.

MACSSIS

Last week all families would have been emailed instructions on how to access the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic School School Improvement Survey (MACSSIS). In case you missed last week's correspondence, Mr Byrne emailed the instructions again on Tuesday.

The surveys are not a test; they are an inclusive way to support the work we are already doing to improve our school.

Our community's opinions are critical to understanding how our school is performing - MACSSIS is a key data source for guiding the ongoing work to improve our school.

The surveys take an average time of 10 minutes to complete. Your participation is greatly appreciated.

The survey window closes next Thursday 28 October.



Formation of Classes

The teaching staff are commencing the process of developing class placements for the 2022 school year. The construction of class lists is a process that requires teaching staff to give consideration to a great variety of factors in an effort to create a social, emotional, behavioural and academic balance within any given class, as detailed in the Rationale of our Formation of Classes Policy:

"At OHR we believe that learning is influenced by a diverse range of factors. The professional knowledge, judgement and discretion of all teachers is critical to the placement of students. The class allocation process should follow protocols which address the balance of social, emotional and academic needs of each child."

A copy of the Formation of Classes Policy is attached to today's newsletter for your reference. Please take the time to read through the policy carefully, as it clearly articulates a range of considerations that need to be factored when placing every individual child into a class. The policy informs the decisions of staff as we collaboratively construct class lists over the coming weeks.

School Closure Davs

- There will be no school for the children over the Melbourne Cup long weekend, inclusive of Monday 1 November and Tuesday 2 November. We are hopeful that restrictions will be eased so that families can manage to travel further from home.
- The school closure day for staff professional learning, scheduled for 2 December, has been cancelled. This day has been cancelled to enable a further day of learning for our students.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And



immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

- 5. How does Jesus listen to our prayers?


RE LEARNING IN YEAR 5/6

This term in our RE/Integrated Rich Concept throughout the school is **Justice**_and the shared understanding that we all have the right to be treated justly and we all have the responsibility to act justly. As part of this Unit, all Year 5/6 students attended am online incursion with Catherine Scerri from Bahay Tuluyan Philippines Australia (BTPA).

Bahay Tuluyan is a children's rights organisation based in the Philippines. Bahay Tuluyan's programs and services are aimed at preventing and responding to abuse and violence against children in the Philippines. They work in three areas in the Philippines; Manila, Laguna and Quezon, delivering social services and programs on the street, in communities and within its centres. Bahay Tuluyan Philippines Australia (BTPA) was established primarily to support the work of Bahay Tuluyan.

During this session our students explored the distribution of resources, people's needs and wants and how power and privilege impacts our lives. There was lots of great discussion and questioning. We will continue to explore the concepts introduced at this session over the coming weeks.
