FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Parishioners,

Remembrance Day, which was originally called Armistice Day, commemorated the end of the hostilities for the Great War (World War I), the signing of the armistice, which occurred on November 11, 1918 – the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

On the first anniversary of the armistice, in 1919, one minute's silence was instituted as part of the main commemorative ceremony. After the end of World War II in 1945, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day as an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all war dead.

The year 2008 marked the 90th anniversary of the Australian attack at Villers-Bretonneux. On April 24, 1918, Australian Imperial Force (AIF) soldiers attacked German forces that captured the

French town of Villers-Bretonneux earlier that day. The action was successful, but the fighting was fierce, and many lives were lost on both sides.

Red poppies are worn on blazers, shirts, jumpers and other items of clothing on Remembrance Day to remember those who died during a war. Poppies were among the first plants that came from the battlefields of northern France and Belgium during World War I. Some believed the popular myth that poppies were rich in their redness because they blossomed from grounds that were saturated with soldiers' blood.



Today, the entire school community participated in a service at 11.00am to honour this significant day on our calendar.

Mrs Hollow will shortly commence working with the classes, during Performing Arts lessons, to teach the children carols in preparation for this special night.

House Debating

At OHR we believe that the skills of debating develop essential critical thinking skills, the ability to make reasoned and well considered arguments, in addition to questioning the evidence behind a particular stance or conclusion.

The House Debating season will commence next week and will continue into the following week. The Senior students represent their Houses during the debating series. Next week's two topics include:

- That parents should financially reward their children for improving personal school results
- That we should abolish the Olympic Games.

The debates provide a valuable insight to the skills developed by the students as they counter one another with their fine-tuned arguments.

In non-COVID years, the Prep – Year 4 students can attend in person as spectators. This year, however, the students and their teachers will view the debates from their classrooms via Google Meet.

We are so excited that the Year 3/4 Camp to CYC The Island can now proceed. The camp is located in the picturesque setting of Phillip Island. The campers will depart on Monday 13 December and return on Tuesday 14 December. What a great way to finish the term!

Prep 2022 Transition Program

- This evening we will be conducting the second information session/webinar for parents of children commencing Prep at OHR in 2022.
- As current restrictions do not enable the hosting of the traditional Dinner and Information Evening, the school will conduct a further webinar towards the end of this month that will cover many of the topics included during the usual dinner. We are also in the process of setting up a morning tea at one of our local cafes which will offer an opportunity for next year's Prep parents to catch up socially in an informal environment.
- This Tuesday morning, we will hold the first on-site transition session for the pre-school children who will be commencing Prep in the coming months.



School Uniform

Over the remaining month of the school year, we ask that families ensure their children are dressed in the appropriate school uniform every day. If any items become outgrown, they are always available for purchase through Surrey Clothing or the Second-hand Uniform Shop.

The end of the school year should never be viewed as an opportunity for children to wear runners every day. School shoes can be purchased at any time of the year. Sometimes we are placed in the difficult position when it is argued that if school shoes are purchased now, the child may outgrow them by the beginning of the New Year. School shoes are always bought with room for growth, and children rarely ever grow a full size over the space of the 5 weeks that is typical of the Christmas/New Year break.

Surrey Clothing also carry two lengths of sports socks with OHR branding. While plain white sport socks are acceptable, we do discourage the wearing of no-show socks as they are not part of the sport uniform.

I appreciate that so many of you endeavour to support the school's Uniform Policy at all times.

2022 Fees and Levies: Repeated

I acknowledge that these times are certainly challenging. Over the last eighteen months, many people and children in our community have been affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic; socially, emotionally and financially.

The current COVID-19 Pandemic unfortunately continues to impact our community, and is likely to continue being a factor for some time to come.

For this reason, we have decided to freeze our fees for 2022, keeping them at the same level as 2021 to provide our families with some financial relief given the current climate. Our Holy Redeemer is committed to continuing to provide an outstanding experience for its students, as a school of choice in nurturing our future leaders in the community. Families may be assured this decision will in no way impact the education provided as the school continues to find ways to be innovative in delivering its curriculum.

Following on from consultation with and advice from our Business Manager, Alex Pettolino, and the School Advisory Council, we have finalised our Fee Structure for 2022.

Sunday Gospel

The liturgy of the Catholic Church provides a framework for reflection which is used by Catholics throughout the world. Each week in the Newsletter, you will find the Sunday Gospel as well as some questions for discussion with your child/ren.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Today's Gospel talks about the end of the world and sounds frightening, but it also tells us that the word of God will last forever, even longer than the earth and the sky will last. Have you ever felt God's love?
- 2. How did that feel?
- 3. God wants us to be ready to meet him at any time. How can you do that?

RE LEARNING IN 3/4PK

In 3/4PK we continue to explore our Religious Education and Integrated Topic: *Justice*.

The overarching idea being explored in this unit is that together we create a 'Just' world. Students will come to understand that we all have a right to be treated justly and that we all have the responsibility to act justly.

In exploring the discipleship of Mary our Mother, students have learnt how communities came to know God more fully as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.




Students identified and drew symbols that sought to explain the Holy Trinity in early Christian communities.

Students explored the significant events of Mary's life, identifying Mary's characteristics and articulating Mary's special role in fulfilling God's plan.




To begin revealing the characteristics of Mary, Mother of Jesus, students explored the thinking behind this famous Renaissance painting by Raphael. They researched the art elements, design process and design features which Raphael utilised to portray Mary in 'Madonna of the chair' in order to inform their thinking about the type of person Mary was.



Mary's unique place in God's plan for Salvation is revealed in the gospel story of the annunciation. As Mary listened and responded to God with faith and courage, she showed how to be faithful to God. Students identified and sequenced the joyful, sorrowful, glorious and light filled moments of Mary's life.

Through study of the Rosary, students made connections between Mary's life and the Joyful Mysteries, Sorrowful Mysteries, Glorious Mysteries and Luminous Mysteries. Students meditated on each of these mysteries as they prayed through Mary, Mother of Jesus with an intention in mind.



Students shared what their families knew about Mary and reflected on different ways that they honour Mary through prayers and celebration.

Students have learned from the example of Mary how to respond to God. Students will continue to explore how the Church continues the mission of Jesus. They will explore how they too are called to discipleship, just like Mary was. Students will explore how their words and actions can contribute to peace and justice in the world; being visible signs of God's presence.

At home you could help your children by:

- talking with them about how Mary listened and responded to God.
- identifying the ways in which your family is faithful to Jesus' law of love.
- highlighting ways people in our communities or families show respect, kindness, honesty and truthfulness in their relationships with others.
- discussing with them the practical ways they can show discipleship everyday through their words and actions.
- acknowledging at dinner time the words and actions which contributed to peace and justice in the home each day.
- offering up intentions whilst you pray a decade of the Rosary together as a family.
