FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Parishioners,

"Life is not about being better than someone else. It is about striving to be better than you used to be." Author Unknown. St Augustine had another good insight when he wrote: "When people choose to withdraw far from a fire, the fire continues to give warmth, but they grow cold. When people choose to withdraw far from the light, the light continues to be bright in itself but they are in darkness. This is also the case when people withdraw from God." And withdraw from God we all do, not out of disbelief necessarily, but mostly out of forgetfulness, because we are just too busy with the rest of life. Take for example the Bethlehem Innkeeper who told Mary and Joseph that there was no room for them in his inn. This did not mean that he was a bad person; he was just very busy taking care of his customers, providing for their needs and keeping the peace. Unfortunately, when the most important birth in history took place in his backyard, he missed it entirely, not because he was a bad person, he was just too busy.

We have the opportunity for a period of anticipation in the Season of Advent. Of course, Advent is a constant season for – within our own lives – we are continuously waiting to become, to discover, to complete, to fulfil. Hope, struggle, fear, expectations, are all part of our Advent experience. God does not come to us from the sky, he comes to us in the daily story of our lives in people, places and events.



Advent invites us to prepare for the commemoration of God's

coming by taking time to have a closer look inside ourselves away from the busy outside. This looking inside is not about remorse or regret, nor about listing ways life over the past year could have been different; it's not about wishing we were better people. It's about forward movement, getting new bearings, setting new directions. It's about a fresh start, getting closer to the "fire" and the "light" that are God's love and compassion.

- A strong commitment to upholding the school's values, and strengthening the community at large.


The two winners are presented with a formal medal to recognise their award.

Whole School Christmas Carols Evening ... it's Getting Closer



At Our Holy Redeemer, formal written reports are provided to families at the end of each school semester. Our formal written reports are designed to be parent-friendly, with a focus on the actual skills, progression, and approach to learning.

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I would sincerely like to acknowledge the thought, time and effort the teachers have put into composing the Semester 2 2021 student reports, which will be live on the *nForma* Parent Portal this Wednesday 8 December. Further instructions for accessing the reports will be emailed on Monday by Mrs Josephine Harrison.

Class Lists will also be sent home this Monday, 6 December, detailing your child's 2022 class and their teacher(s). The staff have been working on developing 2022 class lists over the past month, adhering to the criteria articulated in the OHR Formation of Classes Policy. The staff initially began work on this process in their levels before eventually bringing the lists to the entire teaching staff for final consultation.

May I remind everyone that the decisions made by the staff are governed by the rationale in our policy which states, "At OHR we believe that learning is influenced by a diverse range of factors. The professional knowledge, judgement and discretion of all teachers is critical to the placement of students. The class allocation process should follow protocols which address the balance of social, emotional and academic needs of each child."

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness;
Prepare a way for the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
and rough roads made smooth.
And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

RE LEARNING IN 5/6DU

Learning Intention: We are learning about the Sacrament of Confirmation

Success Criteria

- I can identify Christian signs, symbols, rituals, prayers and practices associated with Confirmation
- I can explain the traditions of the Christian signs, symbols, rituals, prayers and practices associated with Confirmation.

This Term the school Integrated topic has an overarching focus of Justice, within this topic we researched and examined the traditions, signs, symbols, rituals, prayers and practices associated with Confirmation.

Students conducted extensive research and were given many opportunities to explore scripture, and relate it to current Christian practice.

They used their Knowledge and understanding to create Confirmation Games, the students reflected on their understanding and made connections to their lives by playing the games.





Then they assessed themselves using the criteria below:
