FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Parishioners,

The Feast of Christ the King marks the last feast of the Church's liturgical year, which was celebrated on Sunday. The season of Advent starts this Sunday.

The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to remind us that Jesus Christ is the Lord of the Universe, both as God and Man.

This feast day is about looking at Christ the King as our ultimate leader. The most important part of leadership lies in love. Christ the king shows us that the ultimate power is the power of love. Regardless of what happened to him, Jesus Christ always loved. No one could stop him. His love continued to flow from the cross and reveal the mercy and power of God.

The Feast of Christ the King serves to remind us of this love. We are urged not to lose our perspective. Through the power of love, we can effect change in our world and continue to create a life filled with forgiveness and mercy in a bid to build justice and peace.



A New Liturgical Year

The liturgical season of Advent commences on **28 November**. This first Sunday marks the beginning of a four-week period of preparation for Christmas that Pope Francis has called 'a continuous call to hope' (2020).

Advent, a word that means 'coming', was initially a season of preparation for the Feast of the Epiphany (6 January) baptism of new Christians who were 'coming' into a new understanding of the world. They would spend 40 days in penance, prayer and fasting to prepare for this celebration.

Tied to this examination of our baptismal promise, it then became a focus of the coming of Christ, not in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming as the judge of the world. It was not until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to the anticipation of Christ's first coming at Christmas.
